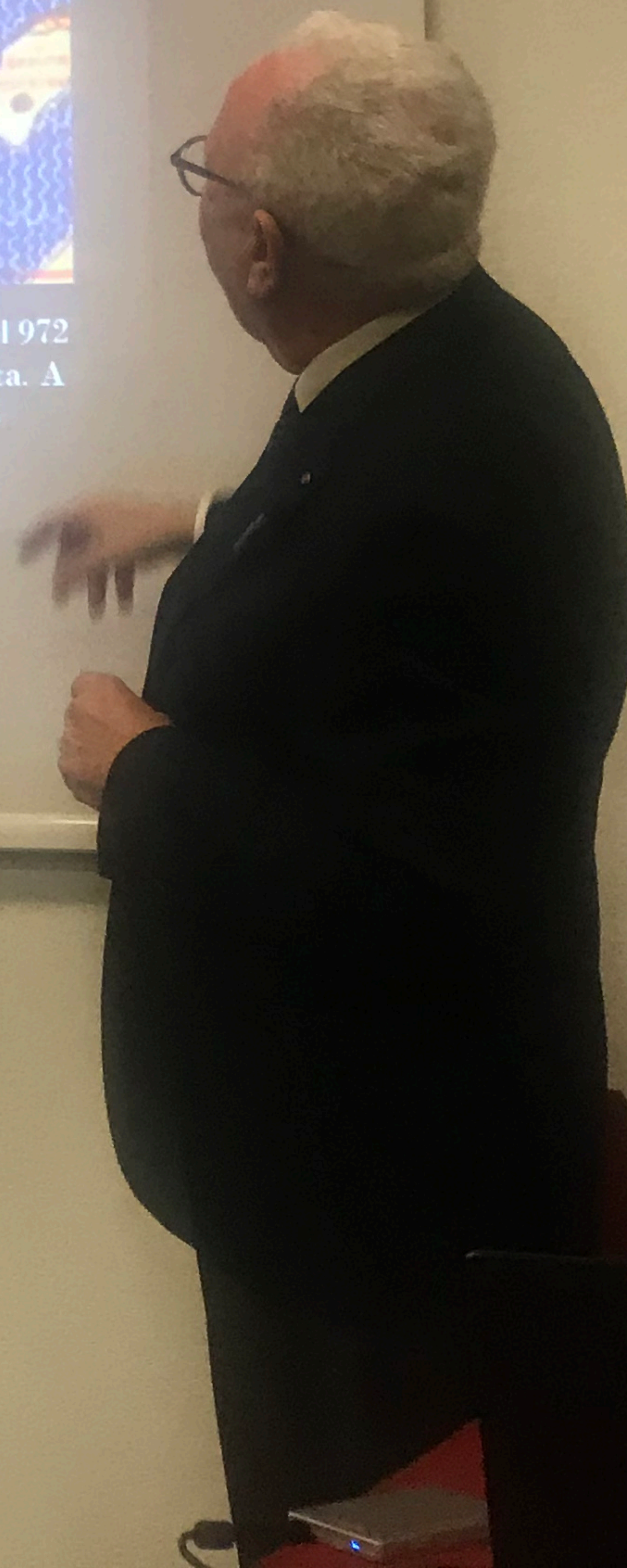
La pianta cresceva lungo il fiume Nilo, il

diveniva utilizzabile

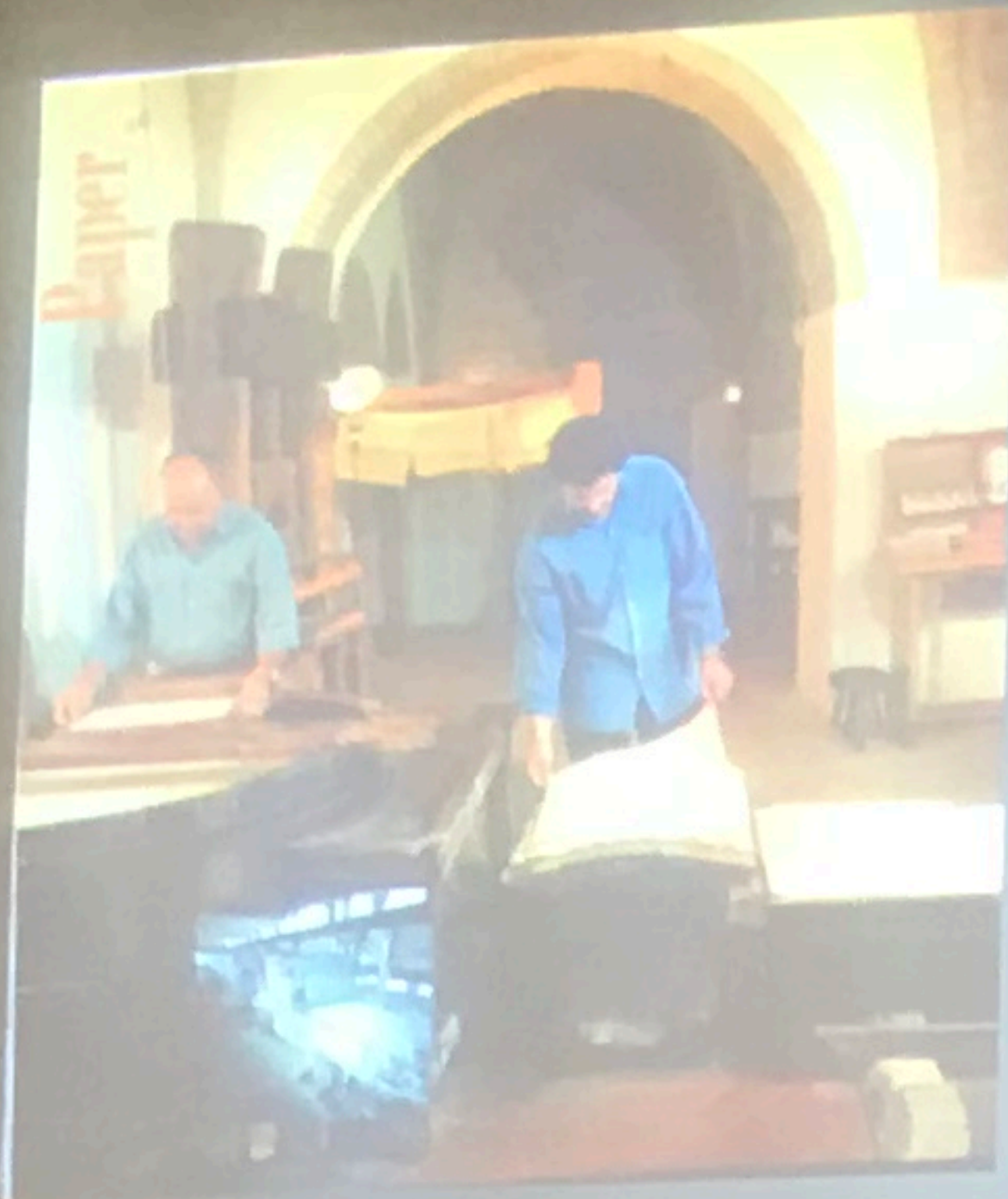
Plinio il vecchio (23-79 d.c.) descrive la
lavorazione del papiro





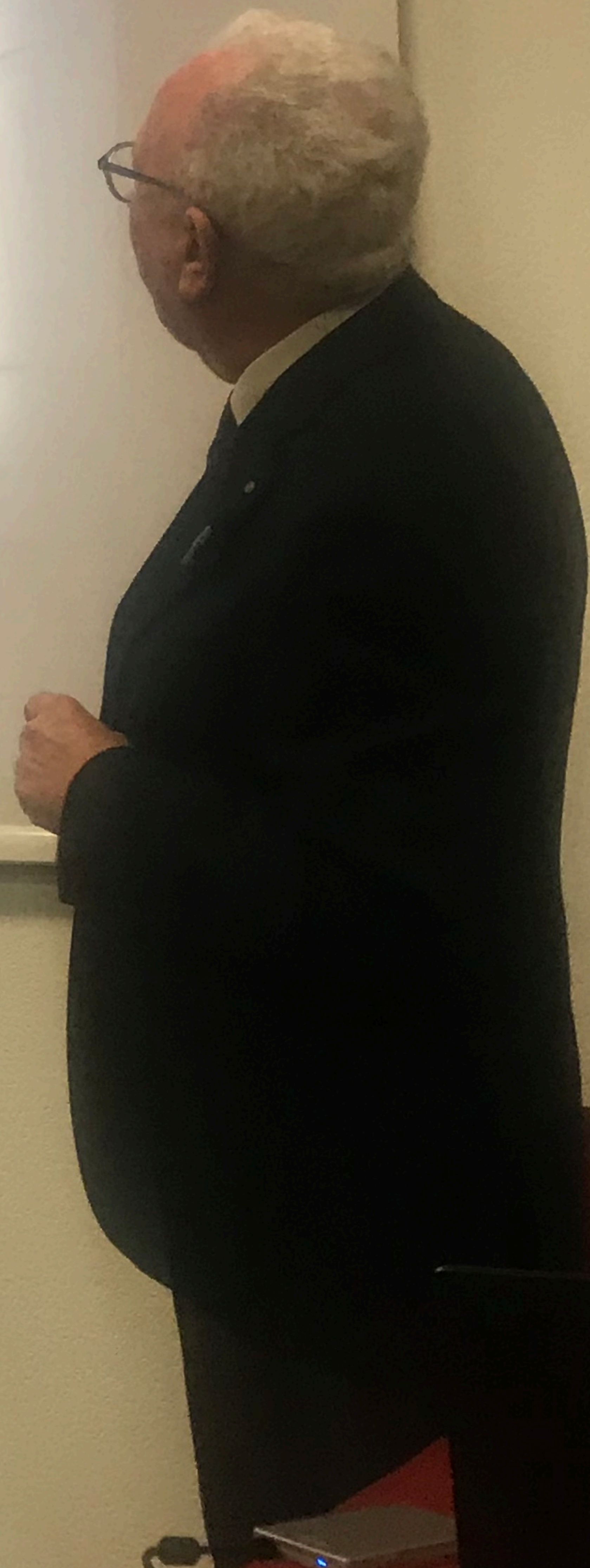
